School PDG Statement



The Pupil Development Grant (PDG) is allocated to schools with pupils who come from low – income families and are currently eligible or have been eligible for free school meals (eFSM).

Schools are expected to make the best use of this funding to implement sustainable strategies that will quickly bring about positive changes for learners.

As a school we have agreed the following steps:

- 1.To plan interventions which make the most effective use of resources.
- 2.To monitor and evaluate the impact of resources.

In 2026 – 27 Greenway Primary School was provided with a combined PDG allocation of £156350 (PDG £137950 + PDGEY £18400)

At Greenway Primary School we have a comprehensive plan, agreed and monitored by Cardiff LA, to promote progress and remove barriers to learning

We will use the funding available to support:

- class awards, Schools trips, school visitors- supplement costs to remove barriers to learning and support recruit, recover and raise standards
- develop expertise of staff to meet needs of disadvantaged learners
- provide intervention and support programmes that are proven to have the greatest impact and to be sustainable, e.g. linking training to the development of expertise of staff to meet needs of disadvantaged learners
- Implement and use data tracking systems to identify learners' needs, target interventions and monitor impact.
- developed leadership capacity to prioritise the impact on the quality of provision and outcomes -DHT to develop and maintain systems for this
- provide enriched experiences through the development of intergenerational community projects through the creative arts/physical activities- sports clubs, gardening clubs, outdoor learning and cooking
- Further develop the wellbeing/nurture room provision
